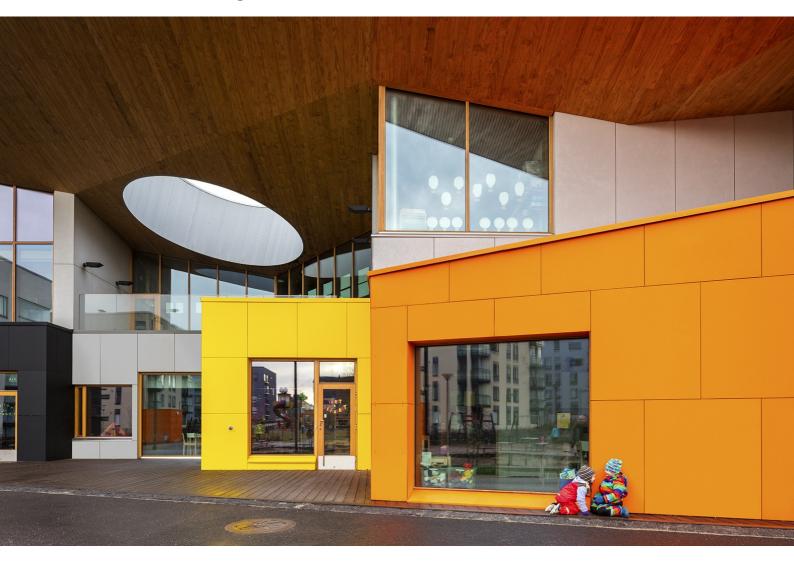

Steni Colour Reuse is a robust stone-composite panel with a smooth surface designed for use as exterior ventilated cladding on all types of buildings. The panels consist of several layers of materials that are hardened and cured to give durability and a long-lasting surface. Steni Colour Reuse is delivered in a wide range of colours and three gloss variations. Low maintenance and a 60-year warranty secure low LCC.

#### Technical data:

Steni Colour Reuse is 6mm thick fiberglass-rainforced stone composite panel with a core of crushed stone, with an avrage wight of 12kg/m2. The panel comes in various colors, sizes and glosses.

The panel has SINTEF technical approval TG 2165.

#### Cut-off criteria:

All major raw materials and all the essential energy is included. The production processes for raw materials and energy flows with very small amounts (less than 1%) are not included. These cut-off criteria do not apply for hazardous materials and substances.

#### Allocation:

The allocation is made in accordance with the provisions of EN 15804. Incoming energy and water and waste production in-house is allocated equally among all products through mass allocation. Effects of primary production of recycled materials is allocated to the main product in which the material was used. The recycling process and transportation of the material is allocated to this analysis.

#### Data quality:

Specific data for the product composition are provided by the manufacturer. They represent the production of the declared product and were collected for EPD development in the year of study. Background data is based on registered EPDs according to EN 15804, Ostfold Research databases, ecoinvent and other LCA databases. The data quality of the raw materials in A1 is presented in the table below.

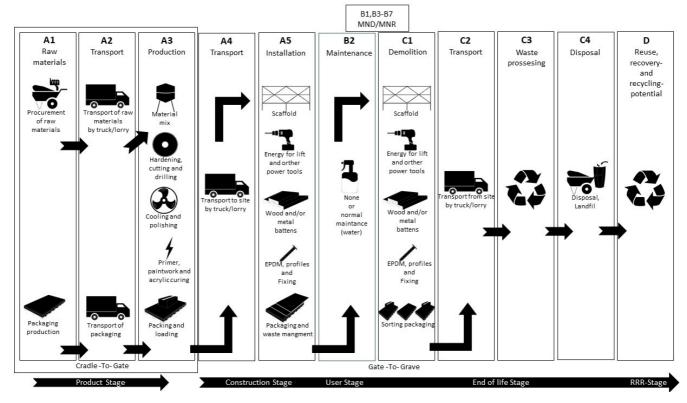
